

PURPOSE, OPERATIONS, and OVERSIGHT

Purpose

- Partnerships in operation 30 years
- To increase
 - Transparency
 - Efficiency
 - Use of federal statistical microdata
- Census-NSF partnership (1998) to establish formal RDC application criteria and procedures
- AHRQ and NCHS joined RDC program in mid-2000's

Partnerships

- Our partners in academia and government conduct research to:

Role

- To facilitate research for a statistical purpose
- To increase access to a wide variety of microdata
- To improve the utility and quality of federal statistics

- To understand the factors shaping our economy and society

FSRDCs Today

- January 2015 Interagency Council on Statistical Policy (ICSP) approves rebranding of Census RDCs to Federal Statistical RDCs
- AHRQ, NCHS, BLS, and Census make their data available to approved researchers through their restricted-access data programs
- Additional statistical agencies are considering, or are in process of, supplementing their restricted-access data programs by joining the FSRDCs





Protections

- Confidentiality
 - Title 13 (Census), Title 15 (NCHS) and Title 26 (IRS) U.S. Code
 - Privacy Act
 - Confidential Information Protection Statistical Efficiency Act (CIPSEA)
- Substantial penalties for violation

ENVIRONMENT


Physical Security (1 of 2)

- Secure Census facility within host institution
- Census employee on-site at all FSRDCs
- Authorized personnel only
- Researcher Special Sworn Status
 - Requires moderate level background check
 - Oath of confidentiality is for life

Physical Security (2 of 2)

- Data accessed via secure connection from thin client device to Census data facility in Bowie, MD
- Printing strictly controlled
- No internet access
- Mandatory disclosure avoidance review of all output
- Data are stripped of PII and (some) BII; Name, Address, DOB, SSN are replaced with Protected Identification Key (PIK); business data delivered with alphanumeric IDs only
