Notice of Intent to Levy and Your Right to a Hearing

As of [notice date], we have not received your overdue tax after sending several notices to you. You must pay your balance by [due date] or we may levy (seize) your property.

What You Need To Do Immediately

Consequences If You Do Not Pay Immediately

- ➤ We may seize (levy) your property or your rights to property if you fail to comply. Property includes wages and other income, bank accounts, business assets, personal assets (including your car and home), Social Security benefits, Alaska Permanent Fund dividends, or state tax refunds.
- ➤ We may **file a Notice of Federal Tax Lien**, notifying your creditors that we have a claim (lien) against all your property. This message may appear on your credit report and harm your credit rating.
- ➤ The U.S. Department of State may revoke your passport or decline to issue or renew a passport if you have seriously delinquent tax debt totaling more than [\$52,000]. For more information, visit www.irs.gov/passports.

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Other Options

If you do not wish to pay directly online from your bank account, you may...

Pay online by card (additional fees apply)

- 1. Go to www.irs.gov/payments
- 2. Select "Pay Your Taxes by Debit or Credit"
- 3. Select an IRS-cleared payment processor
- 4. Pay through the payment processor's website

Pay by check or money order

- Make your check or money order payable to the "United States Treasury"
- Write your employer ID number (nnn-nnnnnnn) on your payment
- 3. Mail your check or money order with the payment stub on the last page

Pay your balance over time

If you can't pay the total amount due, pay as much as you can now and visit www.irs.gov/opa to set up a payment plan for the remaining balance. For alternative options for those with financial hardships, including offer in compromise and temporary delay of collection, visit www.irs.gov/payments

You may request a Collection Due Process hearing. If you wish to appeal this proposed levy action, complete and mail Form 12153, Request for a Collection Due Process or Equivalent Hearing, by [due date] to [IRS return address]. Submission of a timely hearing request will generally prevent levy action. If you do not file Form 12153 by [due date], you will lose the ability to contest Appeals' decision in the U.S. Tax Court.
